Initiative Description

Community Stroke Awareness is an outreach initiative that teaches caregivers, the aging population and family members including children how to identify assign and symptoms of stroke and the steps to take to minimize the damage from the stroke. It also teaches others how multiple strokes can affect someone and limit their daily activities.

Annual Student Activities

- 8 hour class 15 students per cohort
- Students first qualify as Advanced Stroke Life Support (ASLS) instructors, and then run

Community Outcomes/Results

- ↓ Hampton Roads stroke deaths
- ↑ ASLS-trained people in target communities and Hampton Roads
- ↑ Number of students trained in ASLS EVMS is the 2nd medical school to have students certified in ASLS

The Need

- Approved time window for stroke treatment – 3 - 4.5 hours
- Treatment effectiveness decreases as time passes. Education is key in order for emergency stroke care to be successful.
- Ultra-rapid treatment of strokes significantly reduces the odds of post-stroke disability
- Nationwide, stroke accounts for 1 in 20 deaths
