

EVMS' holistic review process for admissions. Implemented in 2015, the process enables the admissions committee to identify students who not only have the ability to succeed, but who possess qualities important to the practice of medicine and healthcare. Those might include overcoming significant obstacles in life, being first-generation college students, volunteering in their communities, serving in leadership roles as undergraduates and taking the initiative to shadow physicians and other healthcare providers. Often, after a school implements a holistic review process, the Medical College Admission Test scores and GPA scores of entering classes go down. "But our MCAT scores have steadily increased over the past five years," Dr. Kimble says, "and our GPA scores remain stable."






