



ACGME Common Program Requirements

II.C. Other Program Personnel

The institution and the program must jointly ensure the availability of all necessary professional, technical, and <u>clerical personnel</u> for the effective administration of the program.

2019

ACGME Common Program Requirements

II.C. Program Coordinator (PC)

There must be a PC supported 50% (2.5 days per week) for administration of the program (residency only)

The Review Committee may further specify (more time)

Each program requires a *lead administrative person who will frequently manage* the day-to-day operations of the program and serve as an important liaison with learners, faculty and other staff members

PCs are *members of the leadership team and are critical to the success* of the program. As such, the PC *must possess skills* in leadership and personnel management.

PCs are expected to develop *unique knowledge* of the ACGME and Program Requirements, policies, and procedures.

PCs assist the program director in **accreditation efforts**, educational programming, and support of residents.

In partnership with the SI, should encourage the professional development of their PCs and avail them of opportunities for both professional and personal growth.

Professional

A paid occupation, especially one that involves prolonged training and formal qualifications
