

Researcher Spotlight-Xian Qiao, MD

Please tell us about your research interests.

I'm interested in Post-COVID (PASC) pathophysiology & potential treatments, acute lung injury & sepsis in the ICU, and improving outcomes for patients & families. Specifically, I'm interested in characterizing dysautonomia in Post-COVID patients, evaluating the potential therapies for these patients and using large databases to review the medications & supplemental oxygen strategies used in determining outcomes, trends, and lessons for future diseases.



As a busy practicing physician, how are you able to manage the demands of research? What strategies do you find to be most effective?

To be successful in research, it requires the commitment of an entire team. The PI can set goals & the direction of the research, but nothing will be accomplished with the support of a dedicated team. Fortunately, I have such a team here at EVMS/Sentara. I rely on the team to gather data, enroll patients, and meet deadlines. The best strategy is clear communication with the team from the beginning of the project & regularly scheduled meetings. Interest & momentum can wane, but regularly scheduled meetings can help to keep everyone engaged.

What are some "hot topics" of research in your specialty?

It's difficult to isolate just a few in PCCM because these two specialties capture a multitude of diseases. Unless something like COVID-19 takes over the world & every specialty, it seems unfair to talk about just one or two of the subspecialty "hot topics." The "hot topics" make the headlines & receive research funding, but this perpetuates the imbalance to other diseases that are actually more common & impactful—but not as well funded. Within pulmonary, there are hot topics in asthma, COPD, interstitial lung disease, pulmonary hypertension, lung cancer, cystic fibrosis, etc. In critical care, acute respiratory disease syndrome, mechanical ventilator strategies, sepsis, to name a few. In the ICU, classifying the different phenotypes of acute respiratory distress syndrome, sepsis, and other high mortality diseases to evaluate different treatment options within the same diagnosis would be important. In Pulmonary disease, evaluating serum biomarkers for early detection of lung cancer is equally important.
