Program Entry Requirement: ~1800 hours of patient care or healthcare-related experience

Clinical Rotations:

- Students are ready to begin seeing patients!
 - O Most preceptors begin with our students shadowing for a short period and by the end of the first week, students are seeing patients on their own.
 - We do not provide a rubric for preceptors to follow. We allow preceptors to guide the teaching and learning based on the population and acuity of patients seen in the clinic/hospital.

• General Expectations:

- Students may work day, evening, night, and weekend hours, following the schedule you provide
- o Goal: average of 40 hours/week
- Acceptable primary preceptors: PAs, NPs, MDs, or DOs (or a combination thereof) with at least 2 years of experience.
- The primary preceptor will be asked to complete a mid-rotation evaluation and online final evaluation of the student.
- The evaluation link is sent out automatically via our Clinical Software System (Exxat) during the last week of the rotation and is easily submitted electronically
- The site will receive information, and a photo of the student assigned just before the rotation, to share with the staff.
- We provide documentation of the student's immunization record, HIPAA certificate, BBP training certificate, certificate of malpractice, and background check if needed.
